Dr. Goldman's Position Statement:

I am honored to be nominated to be Vice President of the ASDS, and I promise to continue the dedicated and effective service of our past Presidents.

In the 25 years since I became a Fellow of the ASDS much has changed regarding the scope of practice for dermatologic surgeons, including, shrinking reimbursements, increasing bureaucratic management of medical records and even patient care. However, the fundamental tenets of our profession remain the same: the obligation to deliver effective, safe and ethical care to those in need and the advancement of our science, including the obligation to teach the next generation.

Dermatologic surgeons have a long history of innovation in research and technology that has advanced the practice of medicine in all specialties. At times, the advancements made by dermatologic surgeons have led to the expansion of other specialties who have even tried to take our knowledge and turn it against our specialty claiming that we are not qualified to perform the procedures we developed. We have only been partially successful in defending our specialty and more importantly defining who we are to not only our medical colleagues, but the general public. I will work to further enhance our society's image so that our specialty can be recognized as the leaders in minimally invasive, safe and effective techniques to advance the treatment of the skin, including reversing age-related changes in skin and subcutaneous tissues.

I will continue the efforts to work together with medical and procedural dermatologists, academicians and private practitioners to advance our specialty, maintain the highest standards of care for our patients, and protect them from substandard treatment being delivered by unsupervised non-physicians.

I have experience in private practice, academic medicine and in the medical industry, running a successful organization of 50+ and teaching residents at UCSD for the last 25 years, as well as 100's of visiting residents and physicians worldwide in procedural dermatology. I have performed over 150 separate clinical studies for 85 different companies. I have published over 300 medical articles and textbook chapters and lectured at over 350 medical meetings worldwide. Thus, I have an understanding of what our society is and what we can accomplish.

The ASDS has taken a leading role as the premier educational resource in dermatologic surgery. I believe that we must continue to meet the educational needs of our growing membership and dermatology residents with national and regional meetings, and continue to support rigorous, systematic research in dermatologic surgery.

Serving as President of multiple national, state, regional and local societies as well as on the Board of a variety of dermatology, vascular and surgical societies, has made me aware of how significantly medical organizations can impact changes for their members.
